Although relatively new to the field of competition, the band is becoming well known as both a marching and concert band. Last year, in addition to its regular marching season, they participated in three marching competitions and Archbishop Wood's "A Night at the Academy", where they received an "Outstanding" rating.

This year they are limiting the marching competitions to those at Spring-Ford, Souderton and Plymouth-Whitemarsh.

With the accent on variety the program includes different kinds of styles, formations and music. A special feature of this year's routine is the kaleidoscopic effect best seen during Ravel's *Pavane for a Dead Princess*. Besides this classical selection are two standard marches: *His Honor* by Fillmore and *March America* arranged by Moffit, and two numbers from the latest Broadway hit "Purlie". These are: "*Walk Him Up The Stairs*", used for the entrance, and "*I Got Love*", the concert number.

There are 72 members in the band, 35 in the color guard and drill team and 14 majorettes. All units are under the direction of Richard Karschner, who last year assisted with the band and this year is its new director. The drill master is Mr. Steve Heck. Paul Kolarik is the Drum Major, Tee Butch is the Sergeant, Betsy Boyd is Majorette Captain and Donna Stoughton is the featured twirler.
