



Keith Stimson High Percussion Award

This award is presented to the highest scoring indoor percussion ensemble, regardless of division, in memory of Keith Stimson, a former Plymouth Whitemarsh High School drum line member who died unexpectedly in his junior year at PW.

Keith was a strong member of the PW marching Colonials drumline and at the time of his death, in 1987, was also attending Tech School studying commercial art. In addition to band activities, he was a member of the Colonial Players theatre group working on stage and behind the scenes, especially on the lighting aspects for many productions.

When not in school, Keith could be found playing in his rock group "Silver Maine", or outside enjoying his skateboard. Before he died, he had successfully auditioned to become a member of the Bridgemen Drum and Bugle Corps from Bayonne, NJ.

Keith had a zest for life, people and a strong dedication to school and musical activities. His father, Ed Stimson, has been a long-time Cavalcade Administrator and a member of the Cavalcade Hall of Fame.
